Addressing global health challenges is only possible by building and strengthening international, inter-continental and national scientific cooperation between scientists, decision/policy makers, private practitioners, industries and health professional and civil society.

EU-Africa PerMed is working towards fostering a stronger global collaboration in PM through the umbrella of **ICPerMed**, and by this, to better tackle global health challenges such as infectious diseases and future pandemics, or the prevention of non-communicable diseases.

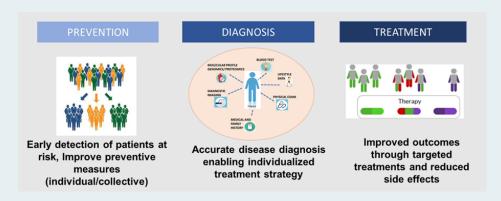
